WHAT THE HECK IS AN AHEC?

Area Health Education Centers (AHEC) are federally funded, state-administered programs that work on improving healthcare access. Most states have at least one AHEC. There are four AHEC Centers in Washington State; AHEC of Western Washington in Bellingham, WA; Eastern Washington AHEC in Spokane, WA; Southwest WA AHEC in Olympia, WA and Central WA AHEC in Wenatchee, WA. Our mission is to improve the distribution and quality of the healthcare, especially in communities experiencing workforce shortages. One of the ways that we do this is by administering the AHEC Scholars Program. We are also committed to supporting continuing education events for health professionals and enrichment/pathway events for students who are interested in exploring health professions careers.

HISTORY

The Washington Area Health Education Center (WA AHEC) Program Office of the University of Washington School of Medicine began its collaborative work with AHEC Centers in Eastern and Western Washington, Wyoming, Montana, Alaska and Idaho in the 1980s. We are still affiliated with Program Offices in Alaska, Idaho and Montana. The WA AHEC has been, and continues to be, an integral part of the larger UWSOM WWAMI program, a 40+ year old medical education program serving the five states. WA AHEC shares the mission and resources with the UWSOM WWAMI program to improve the quality and distribution of all health professionals in our mostly rural region.

Timeline of AHEC Scholars Curriculum

YEAR ONE

AHEC Scholars Kick-off Event 8 online evening classes (Jan-Mar)* + 10 hours of selfdirected learning

40 hours of clinical fieldwork at rural or low-resourced sites

Hands on and virtual training events

YEAR TWO

8 online evening classes (Sept-Dec)* + 10 hours of selfdirected learning

40 hours of clinical fieldwork at rural or low-resourced sites

Hands on and virtual training events AHEC Scholars Graduation Ceremony

*Both online class sessions take place in the second year of enrollment

Requirements

AHEC Scholars are required to complete a minimum of 40 hours of both educational and clinical training each year of the two-year program, for a cumulative total of 80 educational hours and 80 clinical hours.

Didactic Training

- For each year of enrollment, completion of 30 hours of classroom training -8 week online AHEC Scholars course
 - Year 1 Introduction to Team-based Care in Rural and Under-resourced Settings (CONJ 515 for 1 UW credit)
 - Year 2 Advanced Team-based Care in Rural and Under-resourced Settings (FAMED 516 for 1 UW credit)
- For each year of enrollment, completion of 10 hours of Self-Directed Learning (see Canvas site for details)
 - Focus on working with rural or under-resourced communities and enhancing interprofessional skills. There is a good deal of flexibility around this requirement and we welcome your ideas!

AHEC courses cover eight core topic areas including:

- Interprofessional Education
- Behavioral Health Integration
- Social Determinants of Health
- Cultural Competency
- Practice Transformation
- Connecting Communities & Supporting Health Professionals
- Virtual Learning & Telehealth
- Current and Emerging Health Issues.

Clinical Hours

For each year of enrollment, completion of 40 hours of fieldwork.

- Experiential training gives students the opportunity to bring what they are learning in the classroom into a clinical setting.
